# What is ORCID?

- **O**pen **R**esearcher and **C**ontributor **I**dentifier
- ORCID iD is a 16-digit unique identifier
- Free to register and use your iD
- ORCID is used around the world by
  - Publishers
  - Research institutions
  - Funding agencies

*Researchers may find that they require an iD for manuscript or grant funding submissions!*

## UTORid ORCID Login enabled

This offers the researcher ease in logging into ORCID with credentials they already use across the university.

If a researcher has already registered for an account with an @utoronto.ca email address, this system will identify the account and link it with their UTORid.

Also prevents duplication of accounts.

# Next steps

## 2. Work with Liaison clusters to execute larger awareness campaign

- ORCID awareness can be done at varying levels of the university with a multitude of different entry points
- Potential for engagement at the graduate student/researcher level

### Some ideas we can explore with clusters:

- Inclusion of ORCID promotional material and potential ORCID iD registration with laptop or iPad in orientation sessions, student research fairs, new faculty orientations, graduate orientation weeks, library sponsored events, etc.
- Development of “ORCID Clinics” that can be hosted at various faculties, departments, or labs across the campus.
