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Background

- Working group created by the CDMC (Collection Development Management Committee)
- Includes CDMC members and other librarians based on subject expertise from all three campuses
- ProQuest Central is the largest A&I database for review and was the first assigned (yes, more to come!)

Getting Started

- Marlene Van Ballegooie and Klara Maidenberg gathered overlap data for title lists that included alternative holdings
- Each group member had to review the spreadsheets and cross check the catalogue and subscriptions to determine the unique titles
- Also noted any Open Access availability for journals

Defining Unique

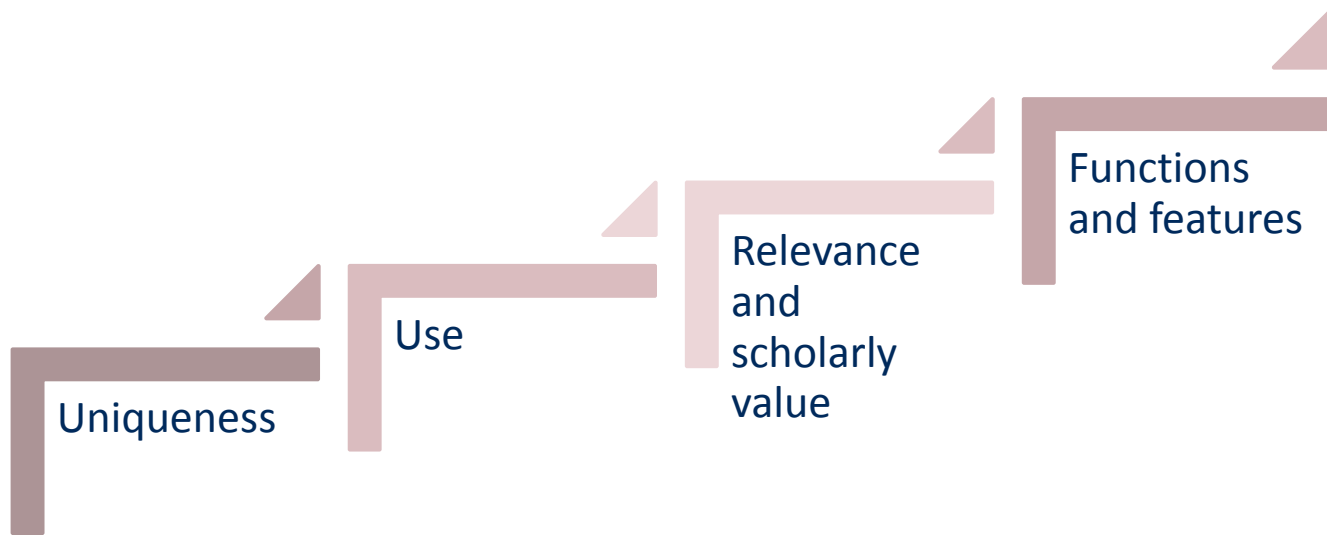
A= Truly unique with no embargo

B= Truly unique but with embargo on current issues

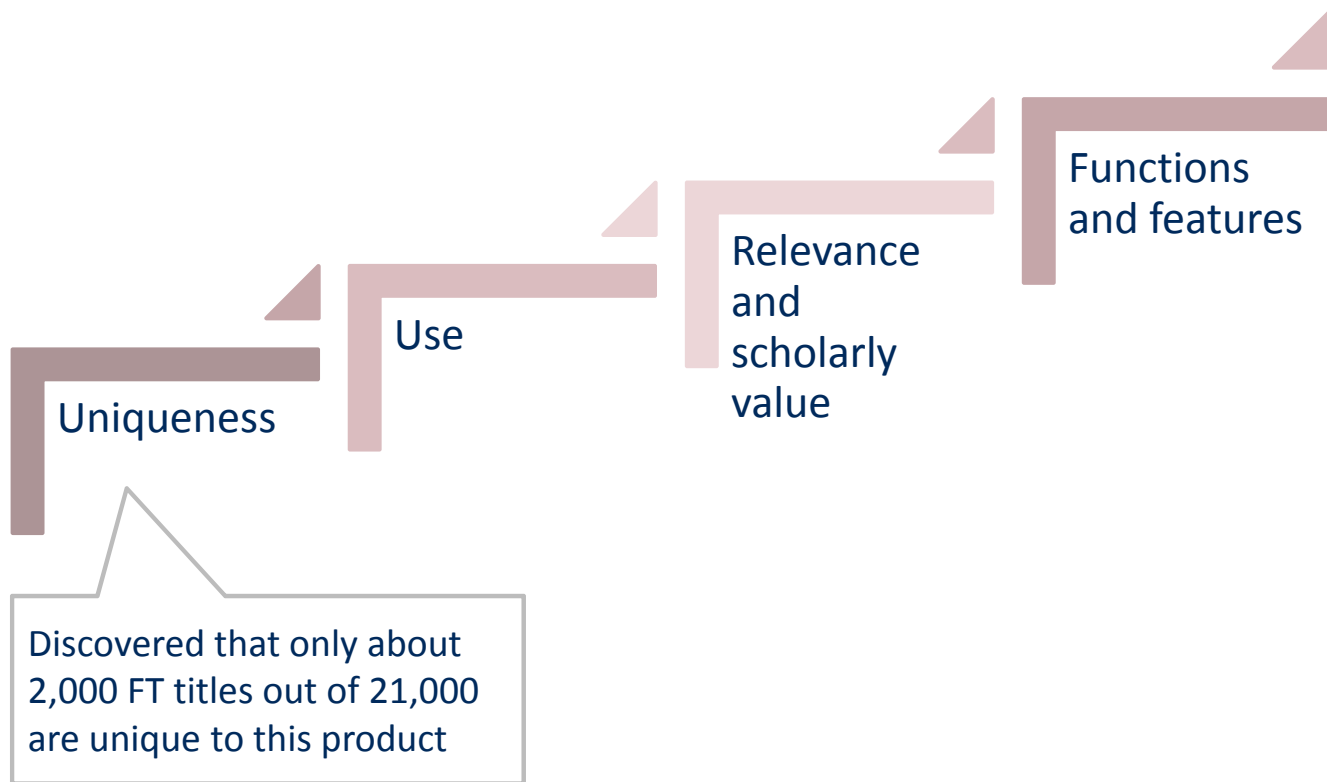
C= Unique in that full-text of current issues available only here

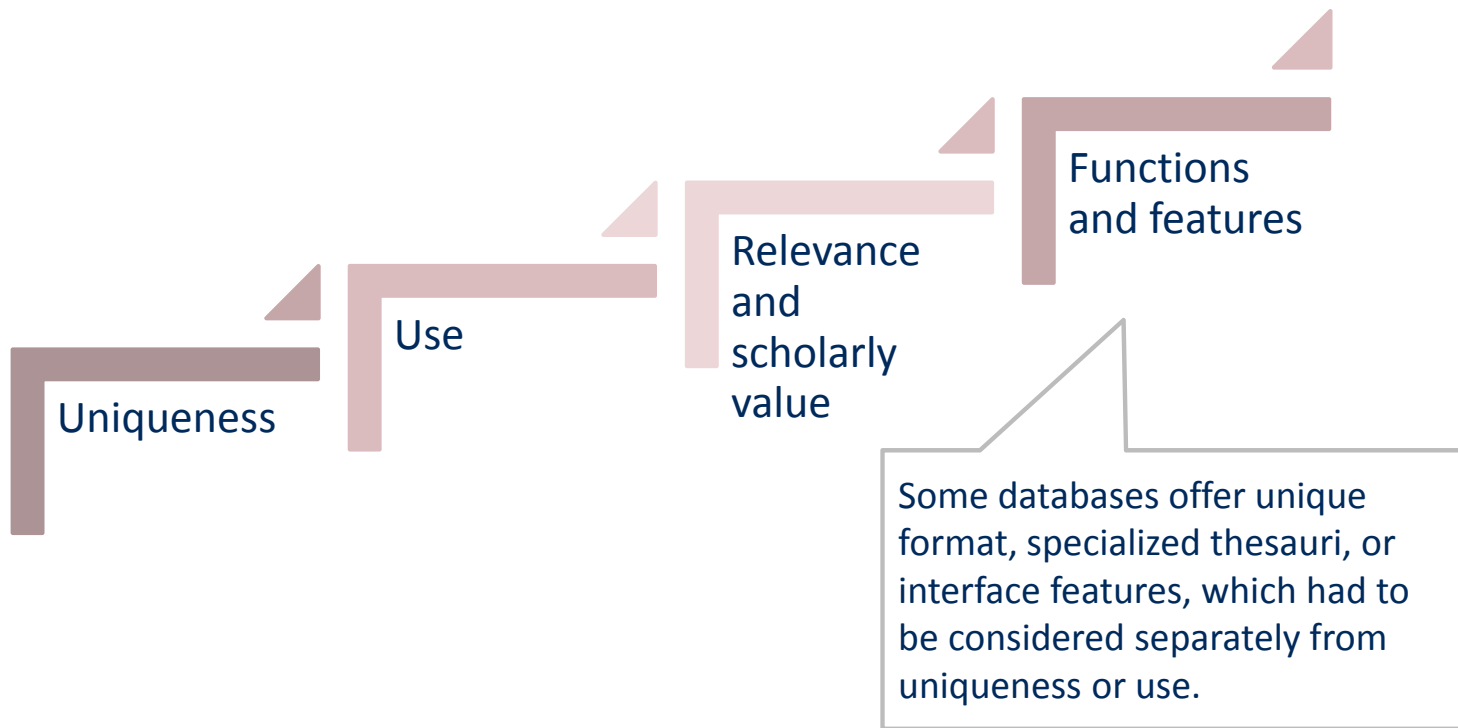


Unique + low use + low scholarly value = not worth keeping
